Application Period for Fuel Assistance Now Open

UPDATE: Deadline to apply is November 14

RICHMOND, VA (November 9, 2022) – The Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) is currently accepting applications for fuel assistance online and at all local departments of social services through Monday, November 14, **2022**. Applications may also be submitted by telephone by contacting the Enterprise Customer Service Center, Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. - 6 p.m. at (855) 635-4370.

The Energy Assistance Program, funded by the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) federal block grant, provides state support to assist low-income households in meeting their home energy needs such as electricity, natural and liquid propane gas, oil, kerosene, coal and wood. Assistance may also be available for delivery and installation charges as well as connection or re-connection fees.

To qualify for fuel assistance, the <u>maximum gross monthly income</u> for a one-person household must not exceed \$1,699. For a household of four, the maximum gross monthly income is \$3,469. Additional income guidelines are as follows:
